# Facebook Cross-App Tracking Opt-Out (iPhone)

If you use an Apple iPhone, a new software update 14.5 will give you the option to opt out of tracking by apps (including from Facebook, Instagram, and more) when you use your phone.

Until now, advertisers have been able to track the actions users take across activity on iPhone – kind of like a salesperson that follows you from store to store while you shop, recording every item you look at. Creepy, right?

## How to Opt Out


Apple's new software update allows users to opt out of cross-app tracking.

Allow "Facebook" to track your activity across other companies' apps and websites?

Ask App Not to Track

Allow Tracking

Click "Ask App Not to Track" to stop this invasion of privacy.



## File Names and Extensions (Windows and MAC)

File names have two parts a filename which is always mandatory and an extension which is at the end of the file name after the last dot or false stop

For Examples:

Mymorlet.doc

<- This is known as 8.3 filename, there are only eight characters for the name and three for the extension. This format was used by older operating systems like DOS, Windows 95/98/ME/XP using FAT file systems.

My Mortgage Letter.docx

<- Windows 10 supports filenames including the extension up to 256 characters. This requires your computer to be using the NTFS filesystem which is now the default

MacOS does not have these limitations as it runs a UNIX like operating system. The Maximum characters for a file name is 256 ( $2^8$ )

## File Names and Extensions (Windows and MAC)

The file name is defined by you, the user, when you create a document, picture, etc.

The extension is automatically created by the application when you save the document some of the common extension are below

.doc	.docx	Microsoft Word
.xls	.xlsx	Microsoft Excel
.mp3	.m4a	Music Files, iTunes
.zip	.7z	Archive or Zipped files which contain compressed files
.iso		Optical Disk Image file
.eml	.msg	E-mail clients, outlook, gmail
.bmp	.jpg .bmp	Image files
.jpeg	.ps .png	More Image files

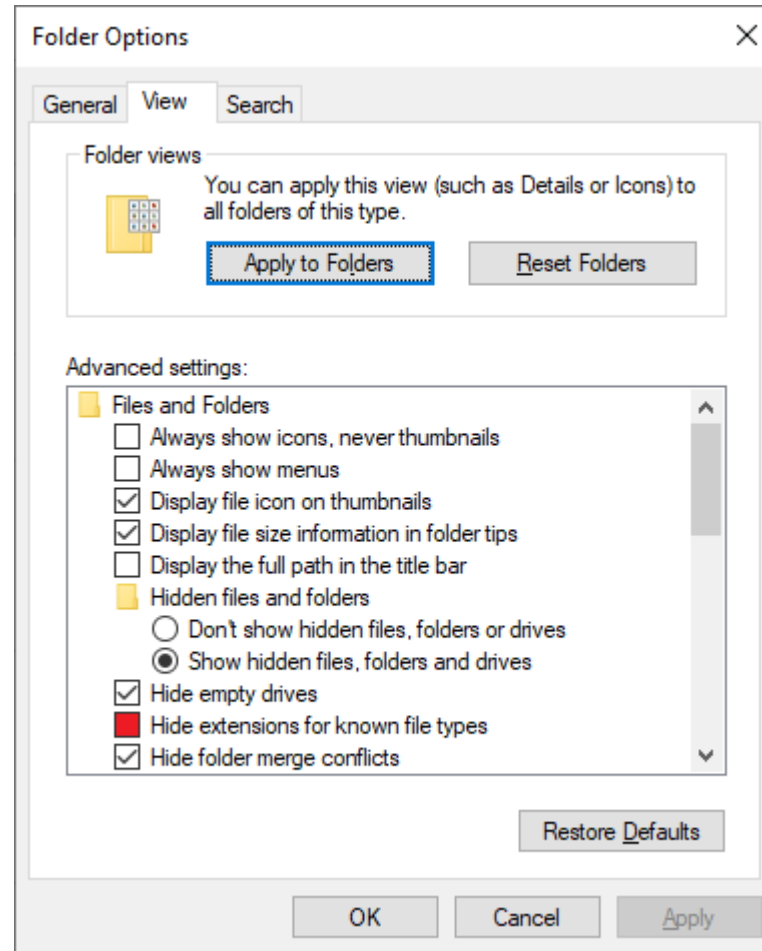
The following are executable file types which, if malicious, could damaged your Computer operating system when run

If you download a program from the internet always download from the software authors site. And virus scan the program before and after installing it.

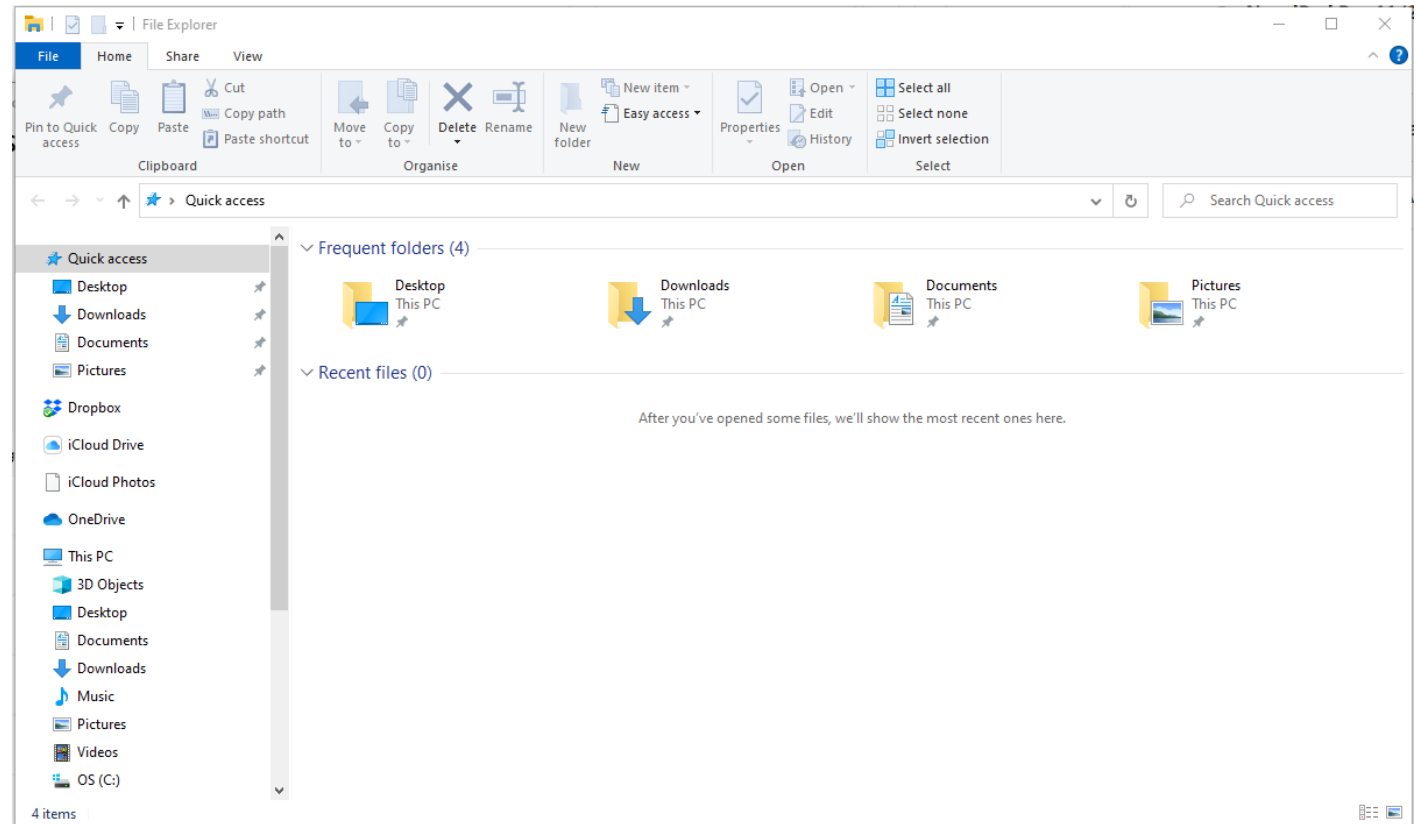
# File Names and Extensions (Windows and MAC)

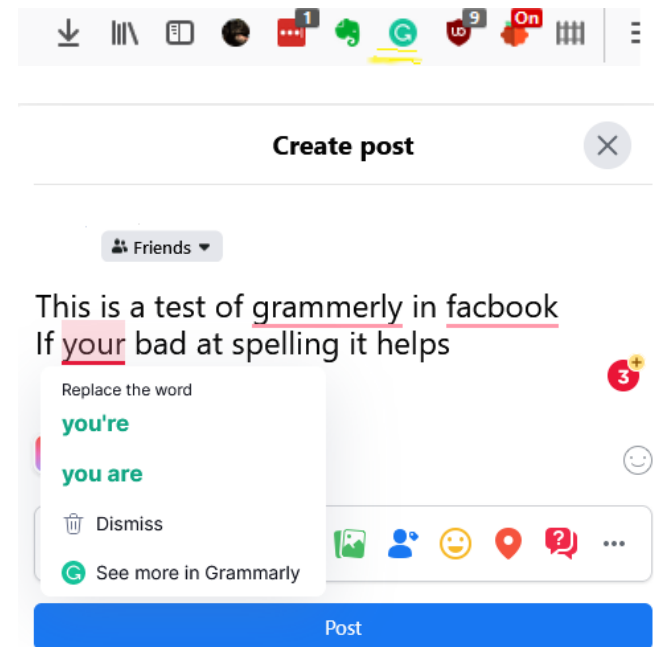
